**July 9: "Go for the Stars!"** featuring ROBO the Friendly Robot! This is a hands on multimedia space program presentation by Gary T. Pozzato, an Aerospace Educator, from Vernon, CT. ROBO talks, moves, and interacts with the audience. Audience participants will help perform demonstrations and experiments.

**July 16: "Dream Big - Read!"** This is a TEAM MAGIC production with Gregory McAdams and his magic puppet. Through stories, magic, comedy and audience participation, and some extremely funny puppetry children will see the dream worlds they can visit when they open a book. Every child dreams of being a princess or a wizard and, of course, superheroes. A super hero transformation is a definite possibility.

**July 23: "Dragons & Dreams - Fizz, Boom, Read!"** presented by Sciencetellers. "With castles, kings, a dragon keeper, an Ice Sorceress, the Horn of Fire, two villagers, and a daring journey to save the entire kingdom, enjoy this spectacular adventure as we're swept away to a world where dragons are real, dreams come true, and only the most daring of people will survive to tell the tale!... Wouldn't dragon's breathe be an amazing sight?!"

**July 30: "The Stories of your Dreams"** presented by The Storycrafters, an award-winning internationally renowned musical storytelling duo. Folktales are told that catch the 'double idea' of dreams in sleep, and the fulfilling of life dreams. This is a storytelling performance for children and families. Barry Marshall and Jeri Burns, PhD have been working together since 1991. They are award-winning radio show hosts, recording artists and writers.

**August 6: "Caryn Lin Presents From Bach 2 Rock!"** This exciting program provides a basic history of Johann Sebastian Bach, the acoustic violin, and electric violin. It covers new developments in music using electronics and modern technology with demonstrations and much audience participation. It is meant to inspire children through action and stories to use their own creativity to realize their dreams without rejecting the wisdom of history. There will be looping, sound effects, and cool music, too.
